- 1:1-2:13: Hosea's marriage
 - *Illustrates the sins of Israel and the consequent judgment.*
- 2:14-3:5: Reconciliation of Hosea and his bride
 - *Exemplifies the hope that God (Yahweh), as loving husband to Israel, offers beyond the judgment.*
- 4:1-10:15 - The oracles of judgment
 - *Corrupt worship, savage politics and foolish foreign alliances spell Israel's doom.*
- 11:1-11: God's offer of forgiveness and a call to return
- 12:1 - 13:16: Closing speeches of judgment
 - *God continues to sound the alarm for Israel's fate.*
- 14:1-9: A love-song
 - *Prophecy reaches its climax as God's husbandly love triumphs over all of Israel's unfaithfulness.*
