(Spurgeon)

FYI: "Worshipping idols by both pagans and Israelites is characterized as harlotry. Pagan worship is not neutral and is never directed toward the Lord." - The Woman's Study Bible (159)

"Unfortunately, the phrase *to play the harlot* was probably not just a figure of speech. Unfaithfulness to the Lord was often manifested in sexual rites with temple prostitutes...an act of supposed union with Baal, Asherah, and other pagan deities. *To eat of his sacrifice* alludes to the love feast that preceded the orgy, reminiscent f the episode with the golden calf." - The Nelson Study Bible (162)



- John 15:4 "<u>Abide in Me</u>, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself unless it abides in the vine, so neither can you unless you abide in Me. NASU
- Romans 12:1-2 Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is-his good, pleasing and perfect will.NIV
- Romans 13:14 But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh in regard to its lusts. NASU
- Hebrews 12:1-2 Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, 2 fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, NASU

(e.g. Curtains: dyeing, weaving, sewing, artistic design) What part would you have like to have worked on?

23. Why do you think they took an inventory/census ("numbering") of the "things for the tabernacle" (38:21) and the amount of metals that were used to make it? (38:24-31) (What would that have indicated to the people about the value/honor of God dwelling among them?)

FYI: "The weight of all the gold used in the work may have been about a ton. The talent weight about 70 pounds and equaled 3,000 shekels." - The Nelson Study Bible (168)

"By some estimations the present day value of the materials used in the tabernacle would total more than \$13 million (DeWitt)... This was a significant project to manage." - David Guzik

- 24. What phrase did the Lord use repeatedly to describe the work the people did? 39:1,5,7,21,26,29,31,32,42,43
 - What does exactness and repetition of all the details about the construction (four chapters of scripture) emphasize about the tabernacle? About the people?

25. What did Moses do? 39:43 How do you think the people felt?

Applying the Word: What gifts or in what way do you delight in giving to the Lord? What does this account teach you about the worth of those gifts, God's approval, and or His ability to use those gifts?

Day 4

30. What does 40:35 say to you about the glory of the Lord? (Compare the dedication of the temple later in 1 Kings 8:10-13.)

FYI: "Throughout this section we encounter two attributes of God. One is His great grace and tender mercy. The King of glory was in the midst of His people! The second is His indescribably holiness. The Lord filled the tent and no one could [enter]!" - The Nelson Study Bible (172)

31. How did the Lord lead the people? 40:36,37 (For an amazingly detailed description of this see Numbers 9:15-23.)

32. How well were God's promises in 29:43-46 fulfilled? 40:38

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33. What would you say about God's answer to Moses' prayer in 33:15-16?

34. How did God manifest His presence later? John 1:14-18

• What privilege do we have? 1 Corinthians 3:16; Ephesians 2:21,22

Applying the Word: Considering the great care and honor God gave to all the parts of the tabernacle, how does that reflect on believers as the dwelling He chooses today? (e.g. What attitude should we have...what responsibilities...what witness...)
