Calling Matthew

FYI: "Tax collectors were considered traitors by the Jews. They were despised because they generally collected more than necessary and pocketed the difference vastly enriching themselves." - The Nelson Study Bible (1590)

"The immediate response by Matthew to Jesus' call... must have been preceded by...his own personal repentance and faith. He would very likely have been a follower of John the Baptist."

- 2. Why were the Pharisees upset? 9:10,11
 - Who does and doesn't need the Lord? 9:12 What do you think He meant by "the sick"?
- 3. What was wrong with the Pharisee's thoughts and actions? 9:13a
 - How did Jesus explain His ministry? 9:13b (Cf. 18:11) Which category would the Pharisees have used to describe themselves?
 - Who are the "sinners"? Ecclesiastes 7:20; Romans 3:10,23

FYI: "People sometimes find that their very goodness stands in the way of seeing that they too are sinful."

Jesus' "mission was characterized by grace, a pursuit of the lost, of sinners. The verb *kalesai* ('to call') means "to invite'."

FYI: "In the OT the bridegroom metaphor was repeatedly applied to God (Isa 54:5-6; 62:4-5; Hos 2:16-20); and Jews sometimes used it... in connection with Messiah's coming ...Thus Jesus' answer was:...He Himself is the messianic bridegroom, and the Messianic Age has dawned." - The Expositor's Bible Commentary

 - From Luke 8:45-47, what did Jesus have the woman do? Why do you think He did that?

Girl Restored to Life

- 11. Why did Jesus dismiss the flute players and noisy crowd? 9:23,24a
 - Why did Jesus say that the girl was just "asleep"? See I Thessalonians 4:13,14 (See also Psalm 17:15)

FYI: "These were probably paid mourners, who in the custom of the day offered an ostentatious display of mourning for a price, not out of sincere sorrow. When we notice how quickly they moved from **wailing** to **they ridiculed Him**, it shows their lack of sincerity."

Demon-possessed Man Healed

 - To whom did the rulers contribute this power? 9:34 What does this say about the enormity of this power? What does it say about their resistance to accepting Jesus?

FYI: "In the Jewish understanding of demon possession, this man could not be helped. This was because the rabbis thought that you could not cast out a demon until it told you its name, and a demon that made a man mute could never be made to tell you its name. But Jesus had no problem, **the demon was cast out** and **the mute spoke**."

 - Matthew 14:14 When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had **compassion** on them and healed their sick. NIV
 - Matthew 15:32,36 Jesus called his disciples to him and said, "I have compassion for these people; they have already been with me three days and have nothing to eat. I do not want to send them away hungry, or they may collapse on the way."...36 Then he took the seven loaves and the fish, and when he had given thanks, he broke them and gave them to the disciples, and they in turn to the people. NIV
 - Mark 6:34 When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. So he began teaching them many things. NIV

Day 4

Jesus Instructs and Warns the Disciples. Read Matthew 10:5-31

2ND DISCOURSE 10:5-42

25. Where and to whom did Jesus send His apostles? 10:5,6

- When preaching the Kingdom, why was it important that the disciples began their ministry with Israel?
- What happened later? Matthew 28:19
- 26. What was their message? 10:7
 - How was their apostleship confirmed? 10:8 (Cf. Acts 2:43; 19:11,12)

Digging Deeper

When was the kingdom promised? 2 Samuel 7:16

Where will this kiingdom be establilshed and what it be like? Micah 4:1-3

FYI: "The 'kingdom of heaven' is a term descriptive of any type of rulership God may assert on the earth at a given period. As a **predicted** kingdom it has reference to the establishment of the kingdom of Israel on the earth (Acts 1:6) and is the subject of extended glowing prophecies in the OT.

The kingdom of heaven becomes the national hope of Israel (2 Sam 7:4-17). John the Baptist, Christ, and the apostles announced that the kingdom of national Israel was "at hand." That offer was rejected. As a result the "kingdom of heaven" in its earthly manifested form was postponed until Christ's second advent."

Warnings and Hardships

28. What discretion were they to show about where they stayed? 10:11-13 What do you think Jesus meant by "worthy" (suitable, deserving)?

29. What judgment could they give? 10:14 What would this communicate? (See Acts 13:51; 18:6)

- 30. What did Jesus warn them about? 10:16a
 - What council did Jesus give? 10:16b (Compare Romans 16:19b) What witness would this give? (See Philippians 2:15)
- 31. What persecution would the disciples face? For what reason? 10:17,18
- 32. What assurance did Jesus give them? 10:19,20 (For example: See Peter's words: Acts 4:13-16)

For examples of persecution, see Acts 12:3,4; 16:22-24; 21:32-33.

 - What were they encouraged to do? 10:22b Why might the temptation to give up increase over time?
- 34. How were they to respond to persecution? 10:23a (See Acts 8:1)
 - What witness is going to take place before Christ comes again? 10:23b
- 35. Why did it follow that the disciples would be treated hatefully? 10:24,25
 - In what sense would that be an encouragement to them? See Acts 5:41

36. Why didn't the disciples need to fear this malice? 10:26 (Mark the words "Do not fear" in 10:28,31,33.

- Amazingly, what response did Jesus tell them to have instead? 10:27 How hard would that be to do? (See Peter's boldness in Acts 5:27-32.)
- 37. What did Jesus say they should and shouldn't fear? 10:28 (Consider: What happened to most of the disciples?)
 - What understanding eliminates even this fear? 10:29-31
